Write the abstract after you have finished your paper, and place it on a separate page after the title page. The formatting of the abstract page is the same as the rest of an APA style paper: double-spaced, Times New Roman 12pt font, one-inch margins, and a running head at the top of the page.

Primary (unfiltered) and secondary sources cited in your paper must appear in your reference list, using APA 6th edition format. The reference page is considered part of your paper, so the reference section is numbered consecutively (page numbers) as part of your paper.

Begin your abstract on a new page. Place your running head and page number 2 in the top right-hand corner. Center the word "Abstract" at the top of the page. Know your target word count. An abstract should be between 150 and 250 words. Exact word counts vary from journal to journal. If you are writing your paper for a psychology course, your professor may have specific word requirements, so be sure to ask.
