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Cef Level B2 C1

The six levels within the CEFR are A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, and C2. These six reference levels are widely accepted as the European standard for grading an individual's proficiency in around forty different languages. Each level is divided into four kinds of competences (language skills), describing what a learner is supposed to be able to do in reading, listening, speaking and writing.

CEF Levels The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEF or CEFR) was put together by the Council of Europe as a way of standardising the levels of language exams in different regions. It is very widely used internationally and all important exams are mapped to the CEFR. There are six levels: A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2. These are described in the table below.

It was established by the Council of Europe and aims to validate language ability. The six levels within the CEFR are A1, A2, B1, B2, C1 and C2. With these levels, you can easily work out your ability in around 40 different languages. The levels are often used casually by language learners to explain their ability at speaking, reading, writing and understanding a language.

For this reason, CEFR introduced its ABC system. In this system, A1 and A2 correspond to very basic language skills. Then, B1 and B2 introduce more sophisticated knowledge of a target language. Finally, C1 and C2 serve as indicators of high proficiency and fluency in this language.

The score 6.5 is borderline B2/C1. The real-world level of performance represented by the result has not changed. It is for institutions to decide whether they wish to change their requirements, if alignment to a particular level of the CEFR is critical (see response to q5 above).

CEFR Levels - All Things Grammar

The descriptors specify progressive mastery of each skill, which is graded on a six-level scale (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2). However, for textbook authors, teachers and other professionals, the specification set out in the CEFR may appear excessively broad, particularly since individual languages are not addressed.

At the end of the test your level of English will be assessed with reference to the Common European Framework of reference for languages (cef). These levels are A1 (lowest), A2, B1, B2, C1, C2 (highest) There are 15 questions in this test. The questions get easier or harder according to your responses.

Free English Level Test. How good is your English?

These levels are classified as A1 for beginners, A2 for elementary, B1 for intermediate, B2 for upper intermediate, C1 as advanced, and C2 as mastery. Expath, like many other language schools, splits these levels in half to accommodate students' time and budget planning (e.g. level A1 is split into A1.1 and A1.2).
