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### Pharmacotherapy Of Depression

Pharmacotherapy for depression should consist of acute therapy up until the best clinical response or remission is achieved (usually 6-12 weeks) and continuation therapy for a further six months to prevent relapse. Sometimes, maintenance therapy will continue for months or years in case of recurrent or persistent disorders.

Pharmacotherapy, Medications. The acute treatment phase is focused on treating the patient to remission. Acute therapy typically lasts 6-12 weeks but should last until remission is reached (American Psychiatric Association, 2013; Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th Edition). Definition: Full remission is defined as a two-month period devoid of major depressive signs and ...

Antidepressant pharmacotherapy Mild depression may be treated with psychotherapy and other behavioral therapies, whereas MDD generally requires one or more classes of antidepressants . 8 In addition, many patients will not achieve remission after their initial treatment with an antidepressant. 6 As such, two or more classes may be required to alleviate depressive symptoms.
