It is a topic that is of interest to research funders as well, with programmes of research being commissioned by the NIHR to answer this question.

The concept of service user involvement was used in policy and strategy, in individual assessment and care management, in service development, planning, delivery and evaluation, in the education, training and recruitment of mental health professionals and at all stages in the conduct of research.

Methods. Qualitative methods were used, reflecting the need to explore people's views and experiences. The researchers carried out five focus groups (reaching a total of 27 service users) and 23 individual interviews, reaching a total of 42 service users. Participants were recruited via two NHS Mental Health Trusts in the North West and Central England.

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Service user involvement in mental health care planning

Service user involvement is about making sure that mental health services, organisations and policies are led and shaped by the people best placed to know what works: people who use mental health services. They are experts by experience. Increasingly, meaningful involvement of people who use — or have used voice in shaping policy and services.

Service user involvement strategy

User involvement is an important aspect in the system development. Many methodologies concern with users in the development phases. Definition of service user (based on Wallcraft 2003). A service user is someone who is receiving or using (or has received or used) primary or secondary mental health care services.. The term 'service user' or 'user' is often seen as referring to those who use mental health services and are more concerned with service reform and improvement than with radical challenge.

Patient and public involvement is thought to improve the way the research is prioritized, commissioned, undertaken, communicated and used.¹Active involvement of service users in research can lead to research of greater quality and relevance owing to the unique perspective that users can bring to a research project.^{2, 3, 4, 5}Interest in involvement has expanded internationally with many countries now actively involving users in research.

The act of involving users is referred to as 'user involvement', which includes all the opportunities that users have to influence services. This ranges from passive user involvement, such as social media analysis, to co-production.
